Dear Parent(s)/Guardian of a camper,

## Some key items to note:

- Please carefully review the COVID exposure conditions to determine if your child will be able to attend camp, and once there, what will happen if he/she is directly exposed, experiences symptoms, or tests positive for COVID.
- Per the parental release form that you signed when you registered your child, if your child needs to come home due to COVID exposure, symptoms, or positive test, you must arrange to pick them up from camp within 24 hrs. of JEMS notification to you.
- COVID test kits will be available at each camp. If you have extra rapid test kits that you'd be willing to donate to the camps, we would greatly appreciate that. Please send them up with your child.
- As a safety precaution, if your child is riding the bus to camp, we will be requiring that your child wears a mask (when medically possible) that completely covers their nose and mouth while on the bus. The bus will also be "NUT-FREE."
- As a precaution, we may advise conferees to wear masks while indoors if any of the staff at our respective camps test positive for Covid. Please have your child bring masks to camp, just in case.

Thank you for your continued patience, cooperation, and understanding. This Q&A is subject to change based on changes to CDC, State of CA, County or Campsite guidelines. If any of these JEMS guidelines conflict with the guidelines from these agencies, the agency guidelines will supersede the JEMS guidelines.

Please be assured that JEMS is committed to doing all that we can to ensure that your child enjoys a safe, and enjoyable week of camp!
